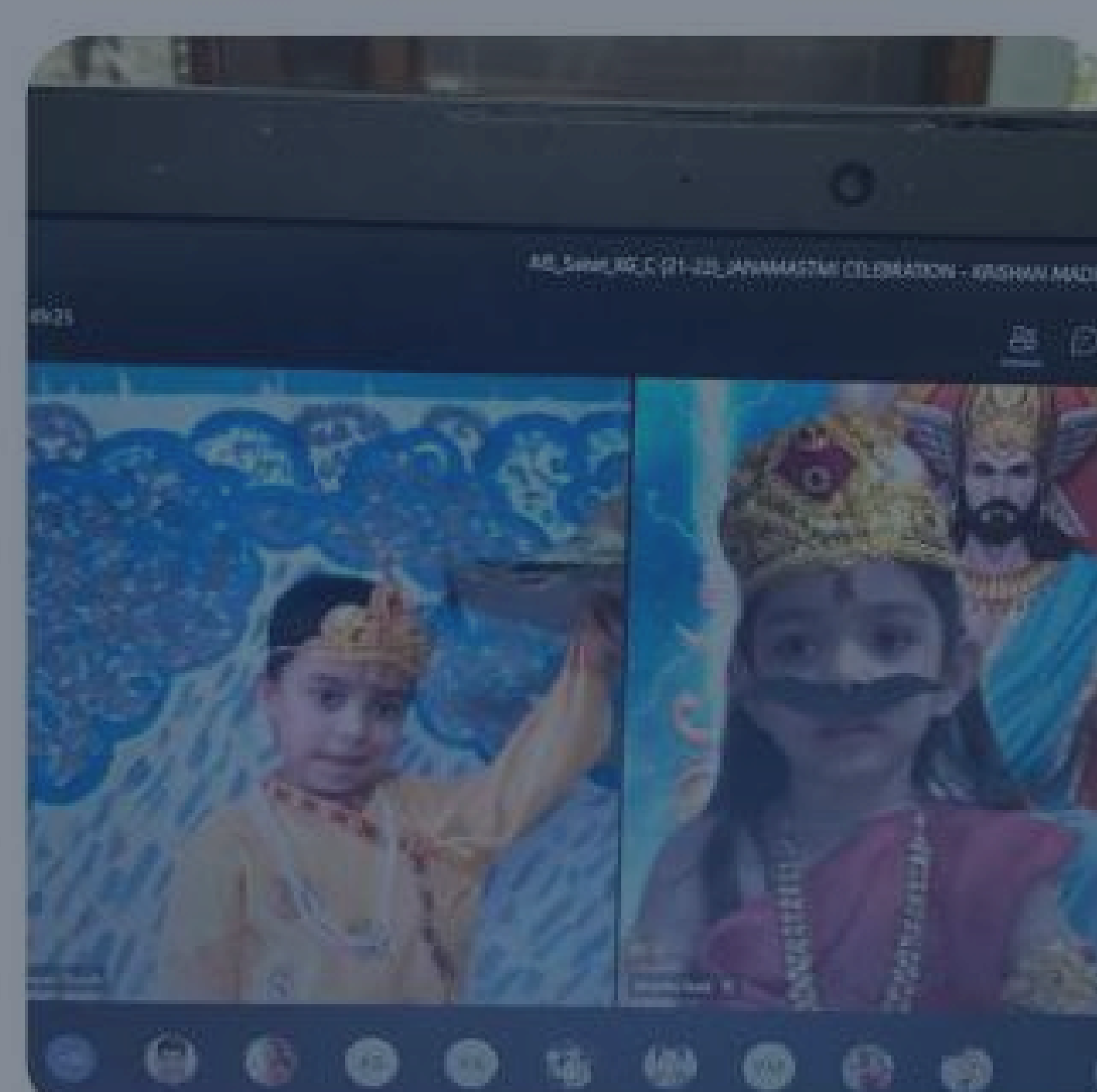
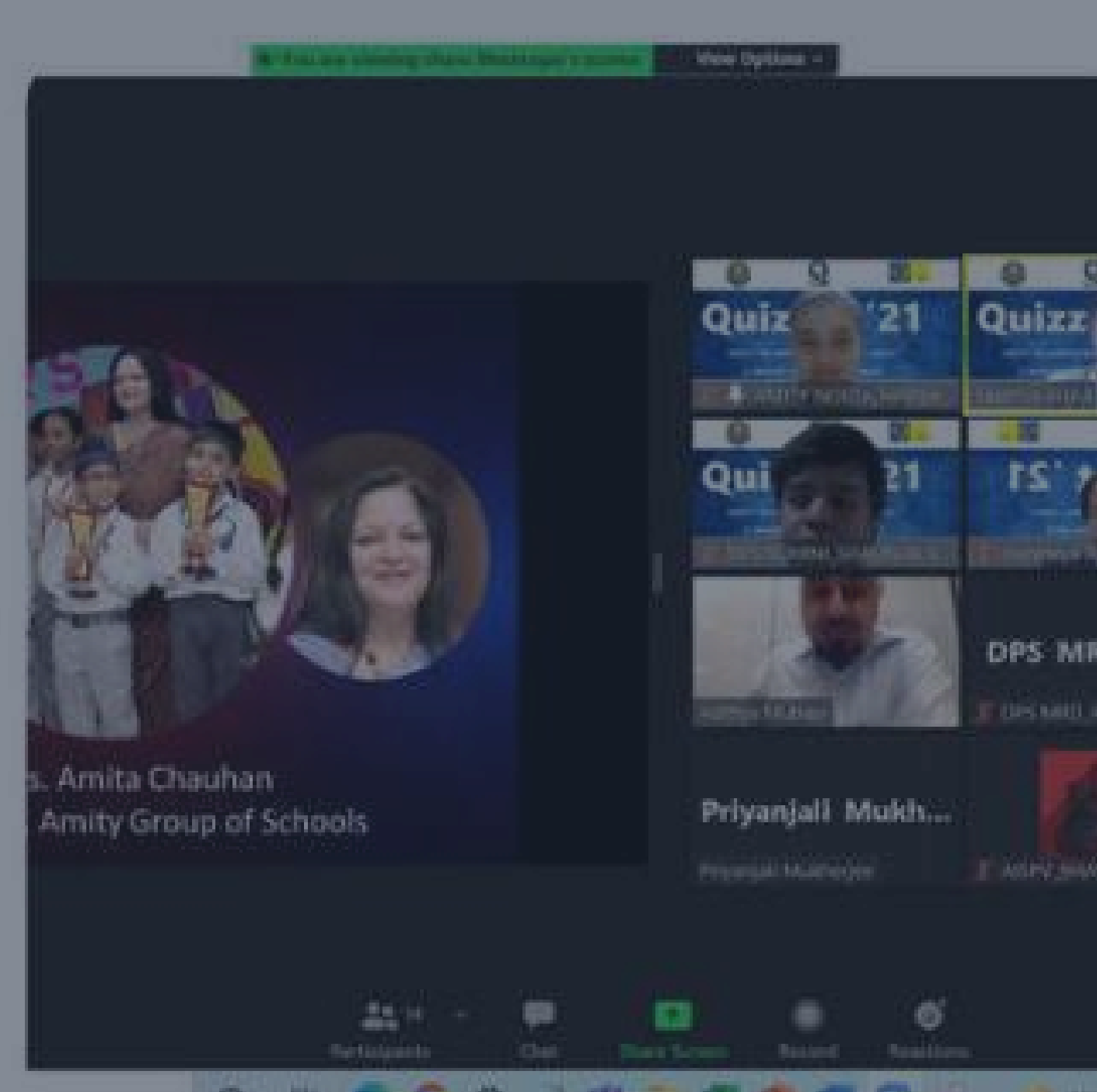

# PEC ACTIVITY

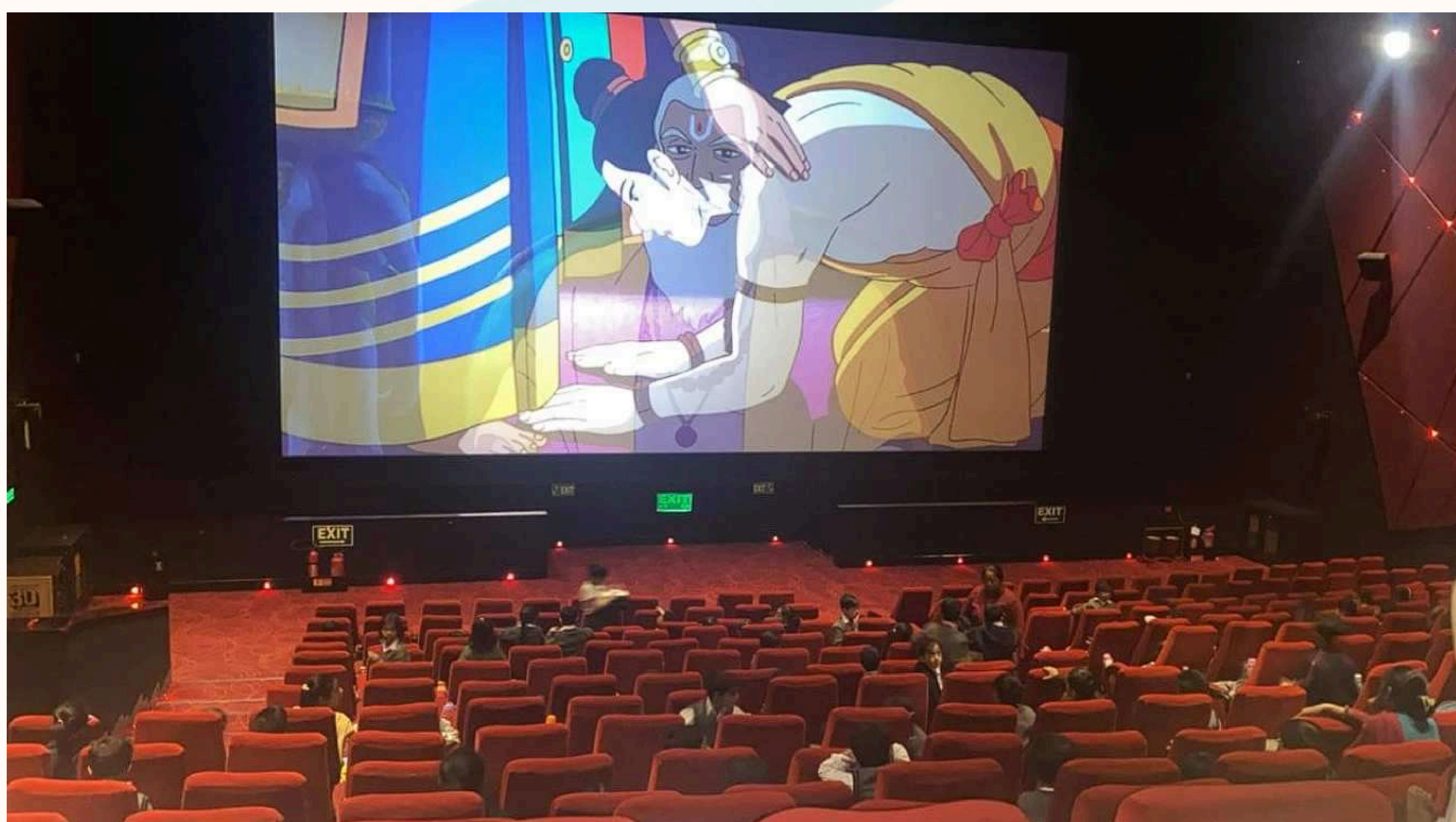

Using a cue card, the teacher showed the students the numbers they stood on, and they then hopped to the number that came before it. The young students' comprehension of the numerical sequence and sense of numerical order were enhanced by this interactive exercise. Moving along the number line gave the students a practical grasp of the idea of "before," which helped them develop their future math abilities.





# APPLE VOWEL RACE

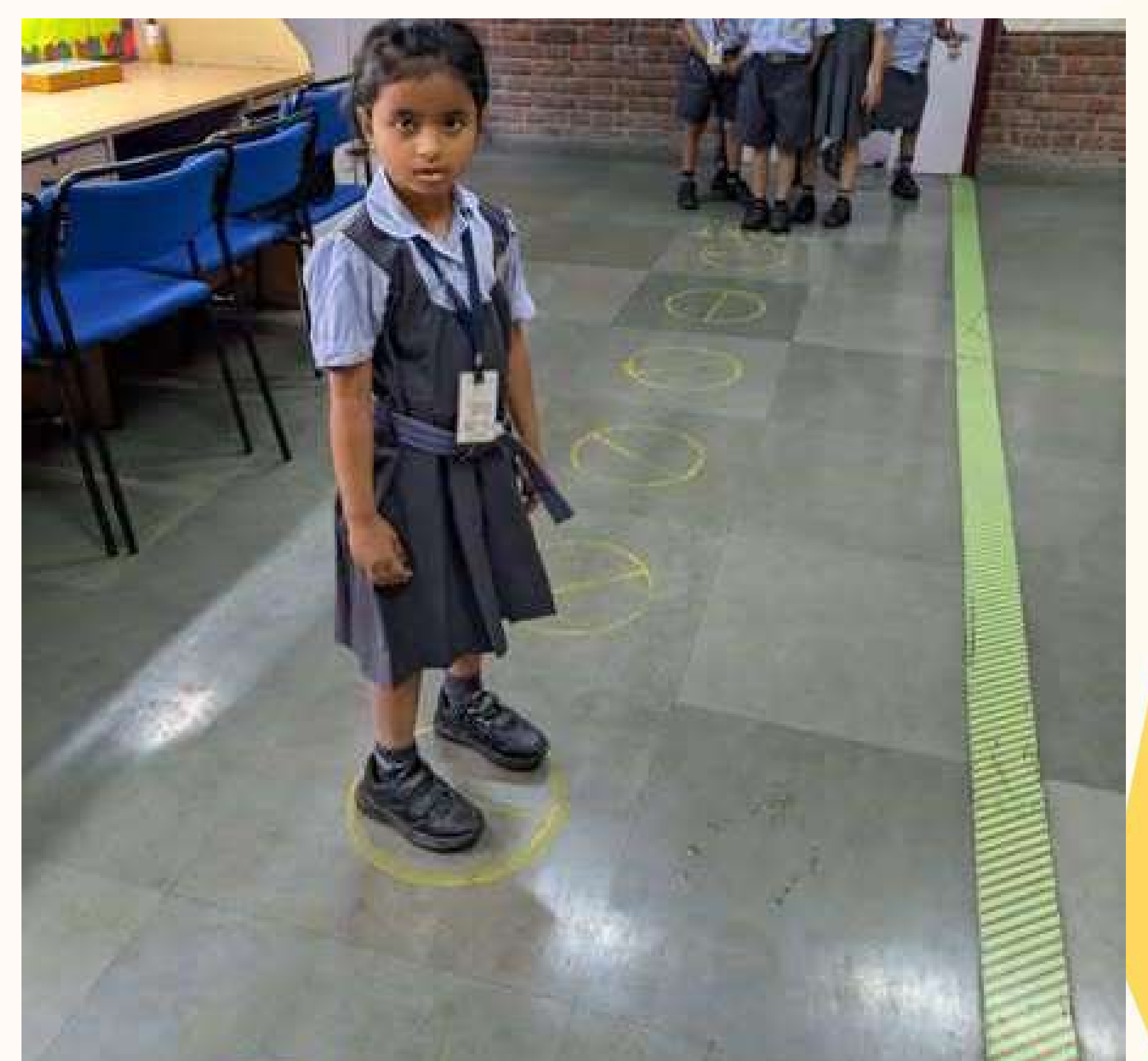
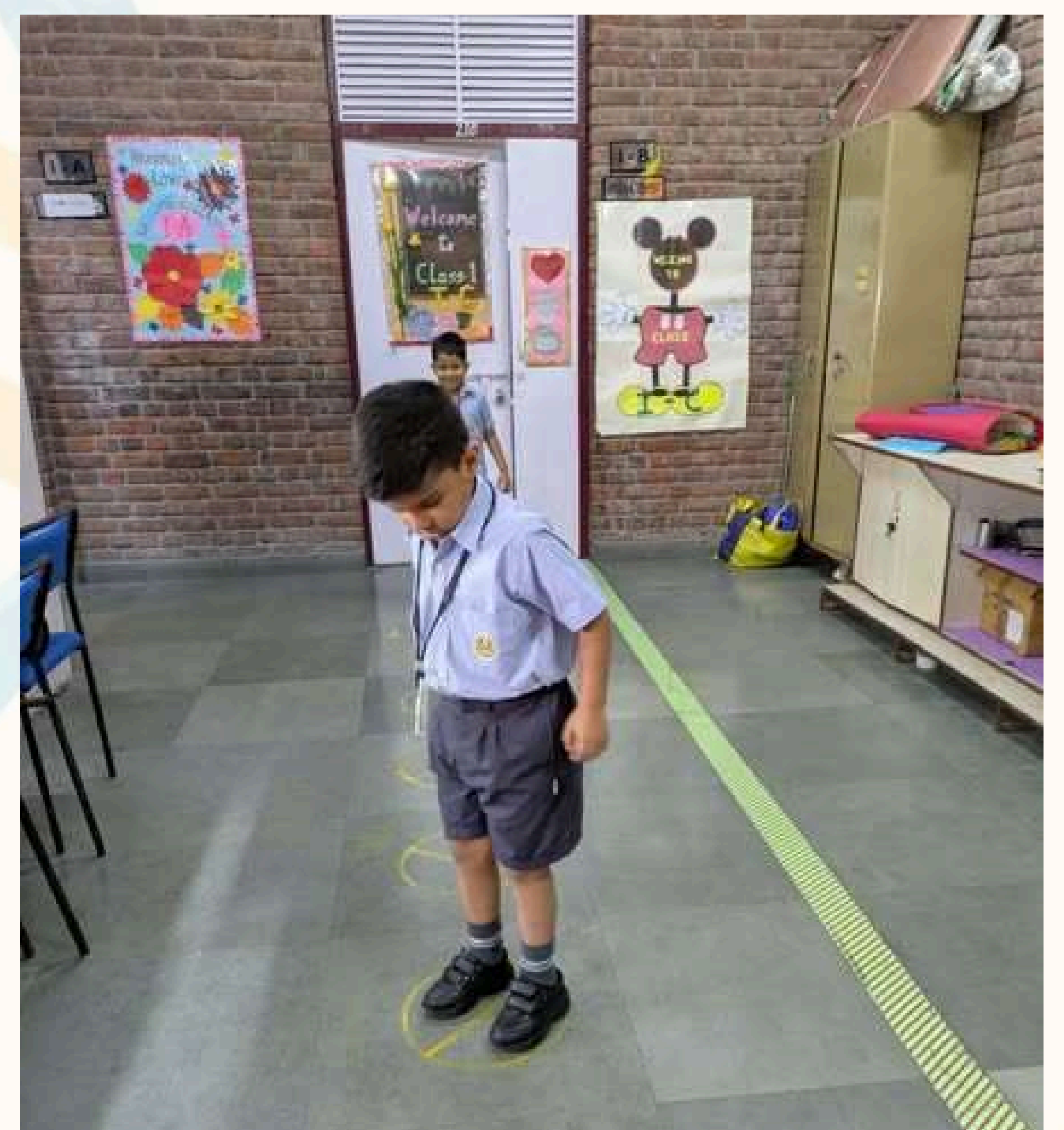
Class 1 students eagerly took part in an entertaining and engaging Apple Vowel Race, where vowel-containing words were strewn all over the floor. Every student was given a bag with a particular vowel category label on it. Finding and gathering words that fit the vowel category listed on their individual bags was their task. The winner was the student who was able to collect all of the matching words in the shortest amount of time. Pupils were able to recognize and distinguish between words' vowel sounds. In addition to involving physical activity, teamwork, sportsmanship, and time management, this improved word recognition and reading fluency.





# JUMP TRAIL

Class 1 students engaged in an exciting game where they had to hop through a series of circles that were drawn on the ground. A line was drawn through each circle, providing a visual cue to aid in movement guidance and improve coordination. The development of gross motor skills like balance, agility, and spatial awareness was greatly aided by this straightforward setup. Students developed their physical endurance, learned to follow visual patterns, and practiced body control as they leaped from one circle to another. Step, Jump, and Balance was a great success all around.

# JAM SESSION- PROTECT YOUR FUTURE



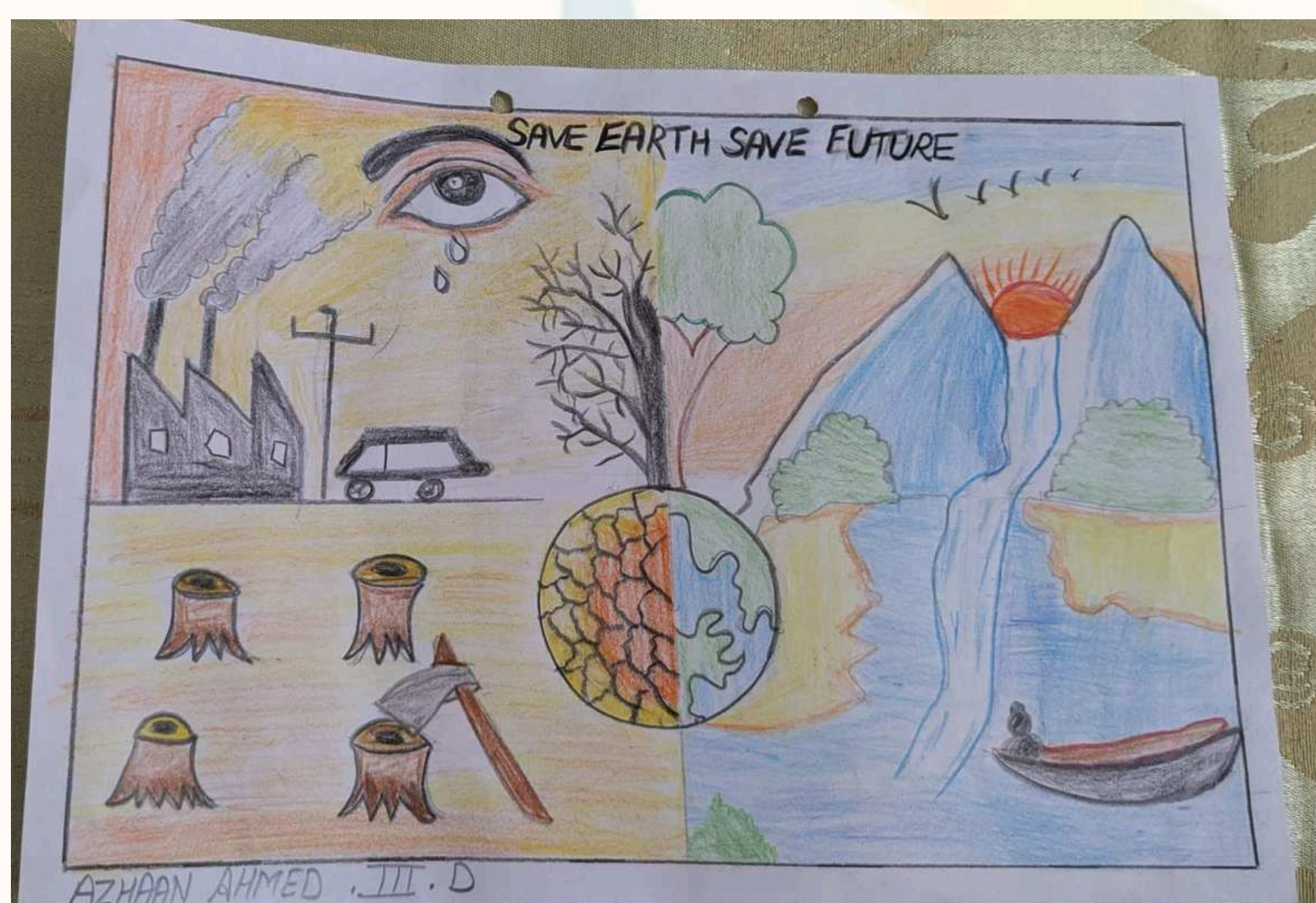

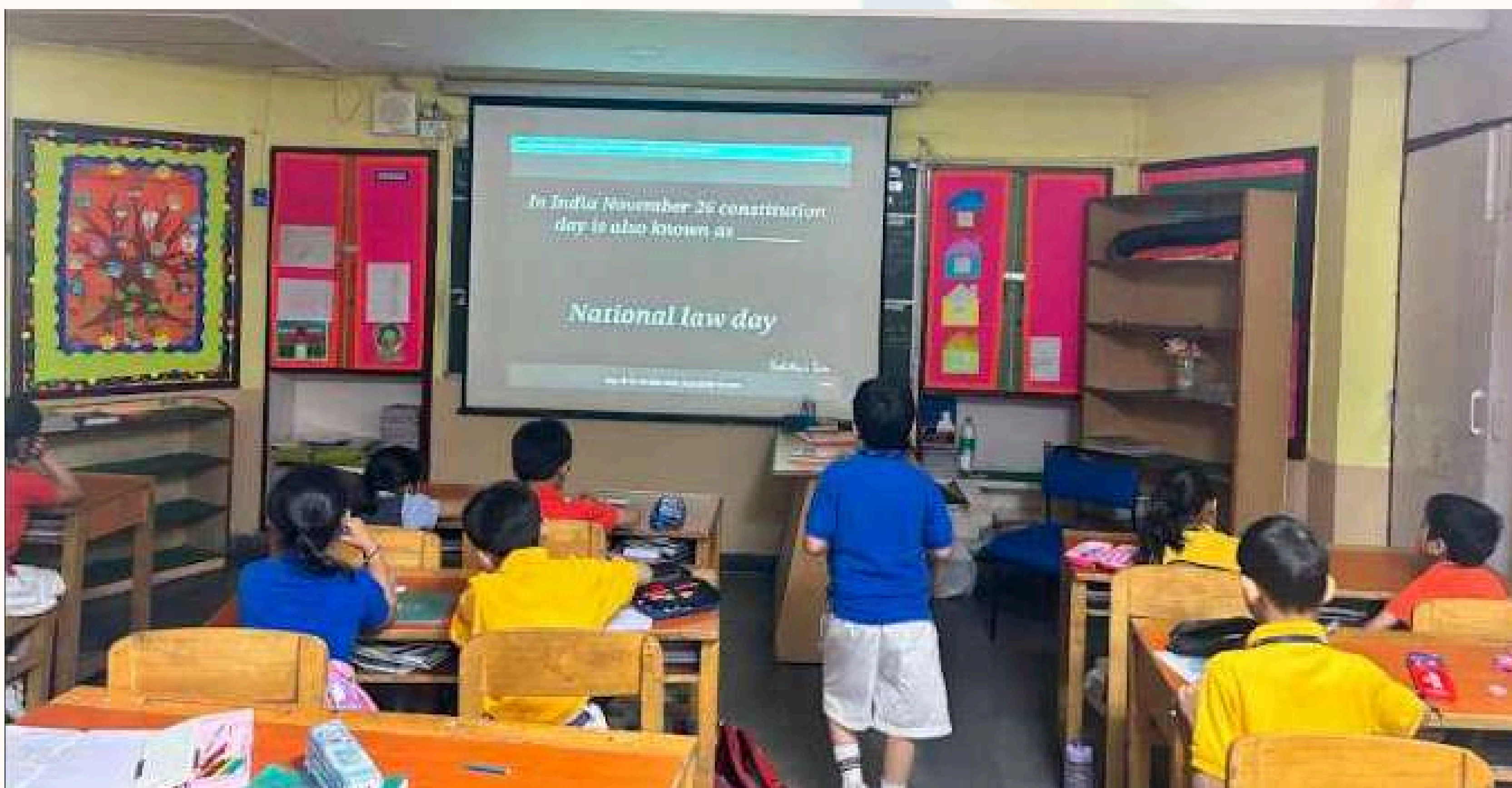




# BIRTH ANNIVERSARY OF DR. BR. AMBEDKAR

A truly empowering experience for all!

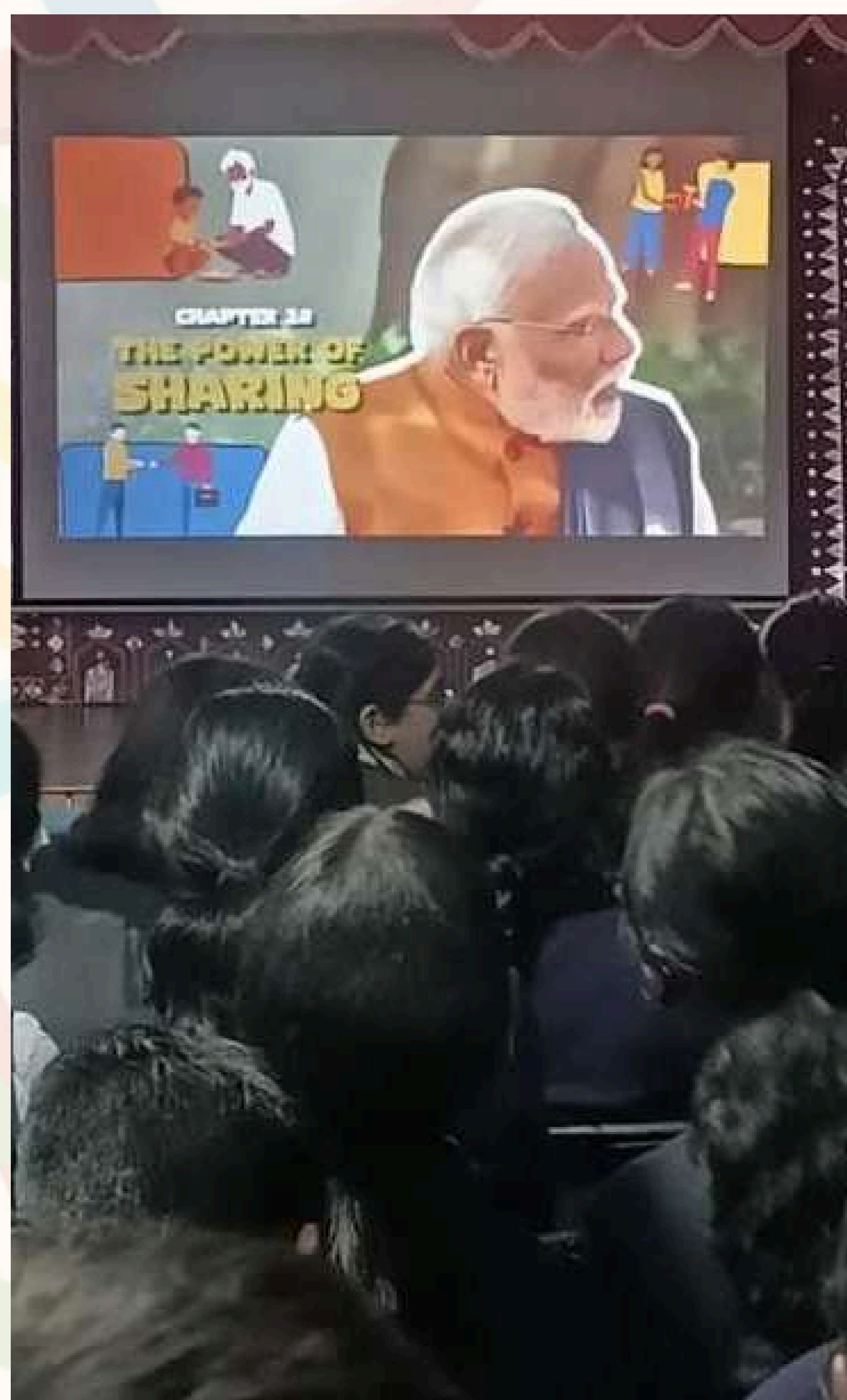




# PARIKSHA PE CHARCHA

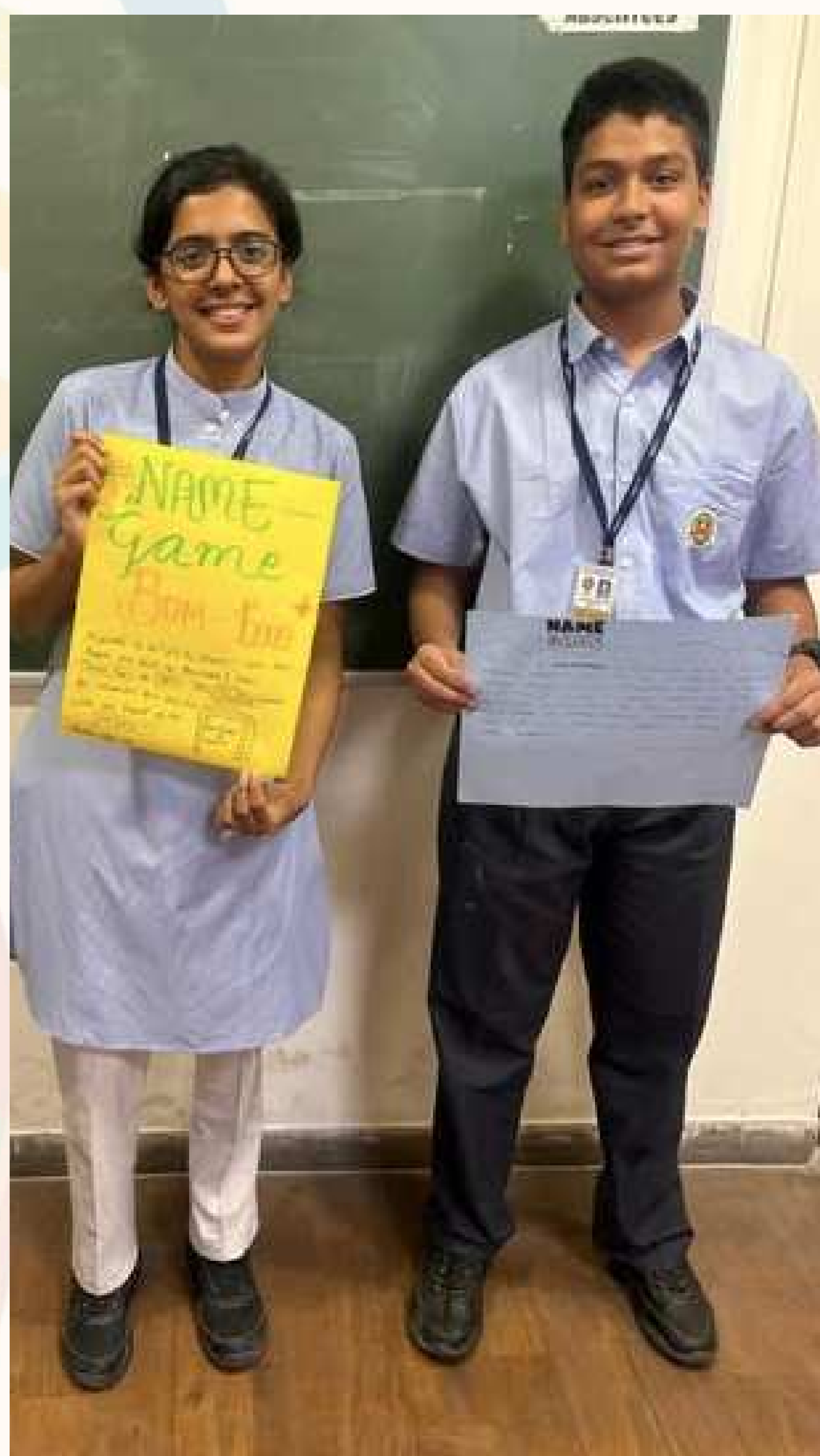


# INTERESTING GAMES

*God said, "Dear tree, you have finally learnt your lesson, Now I am blessing you with a good life span as my gift."*

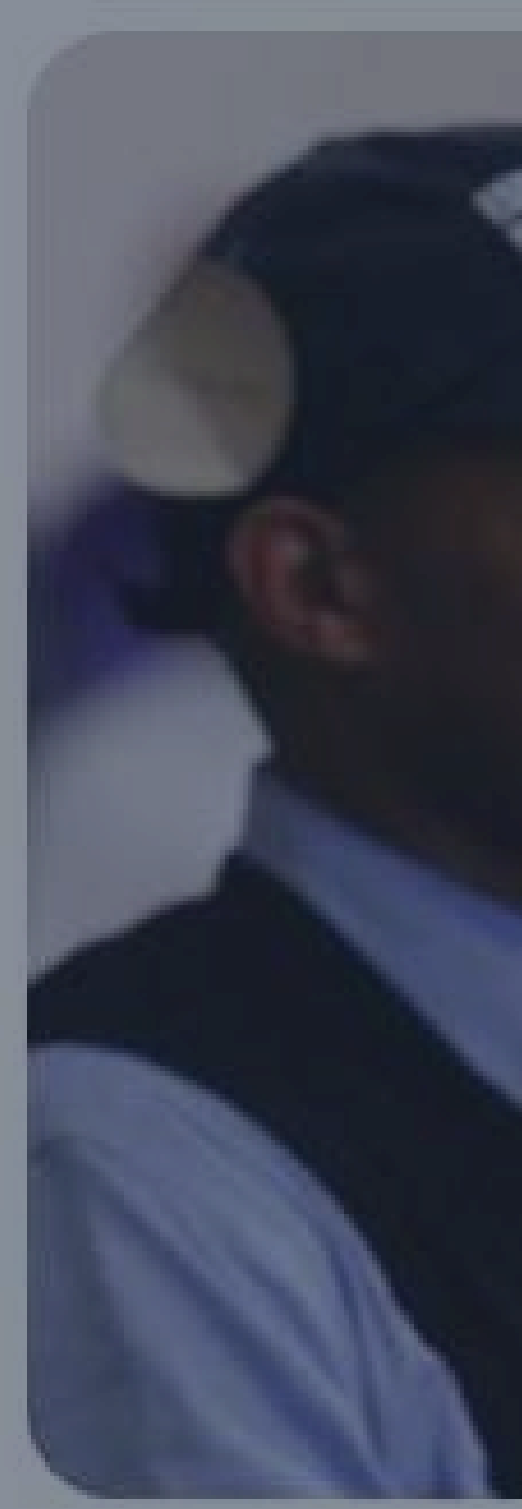
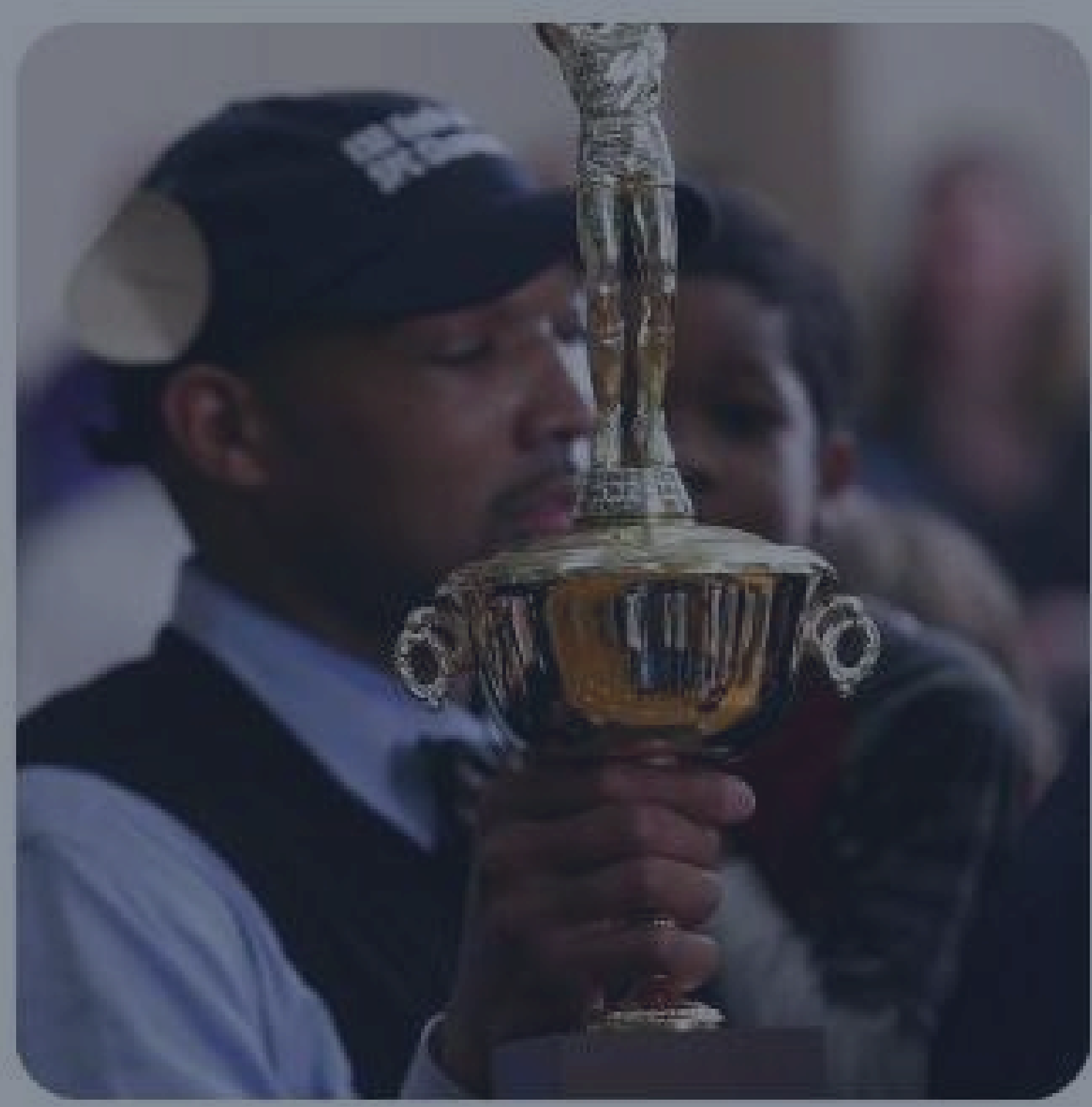
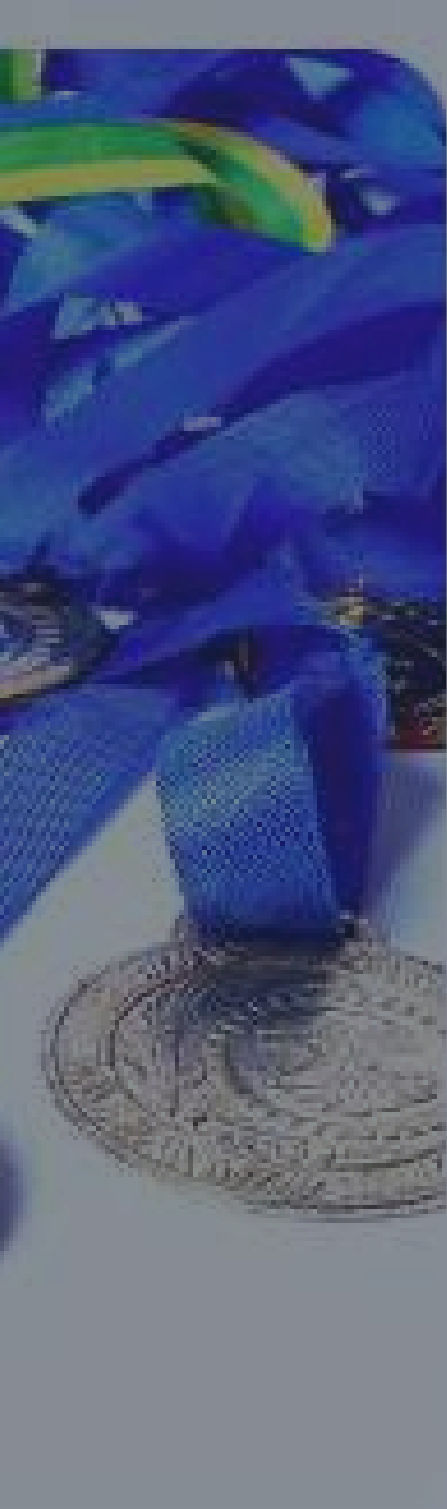
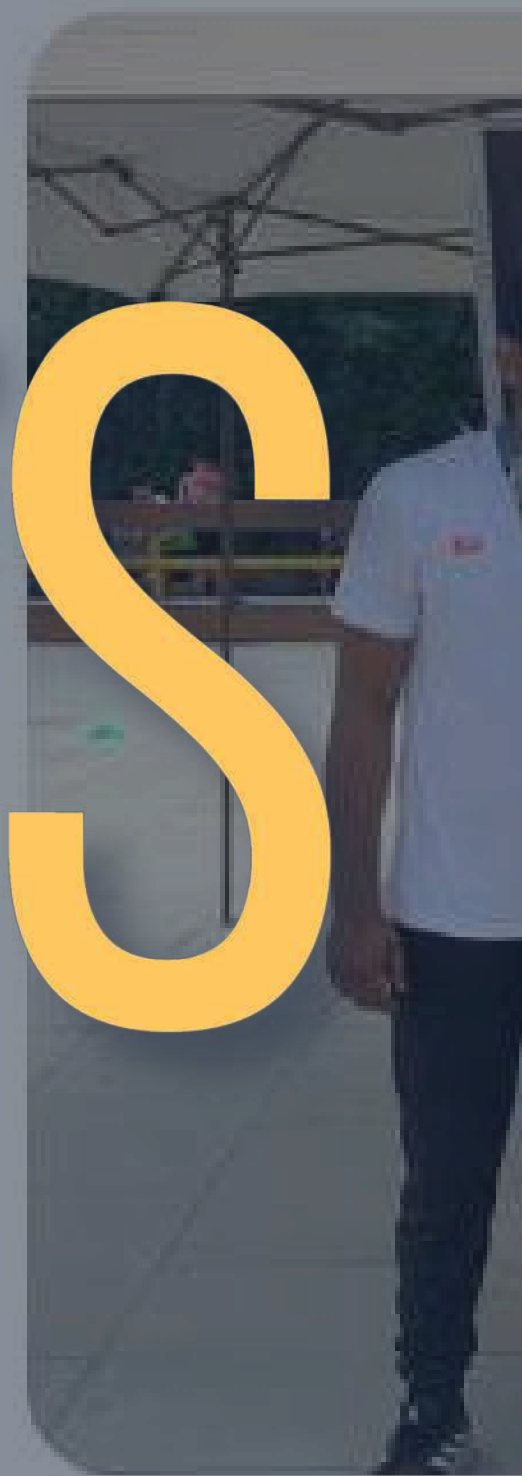

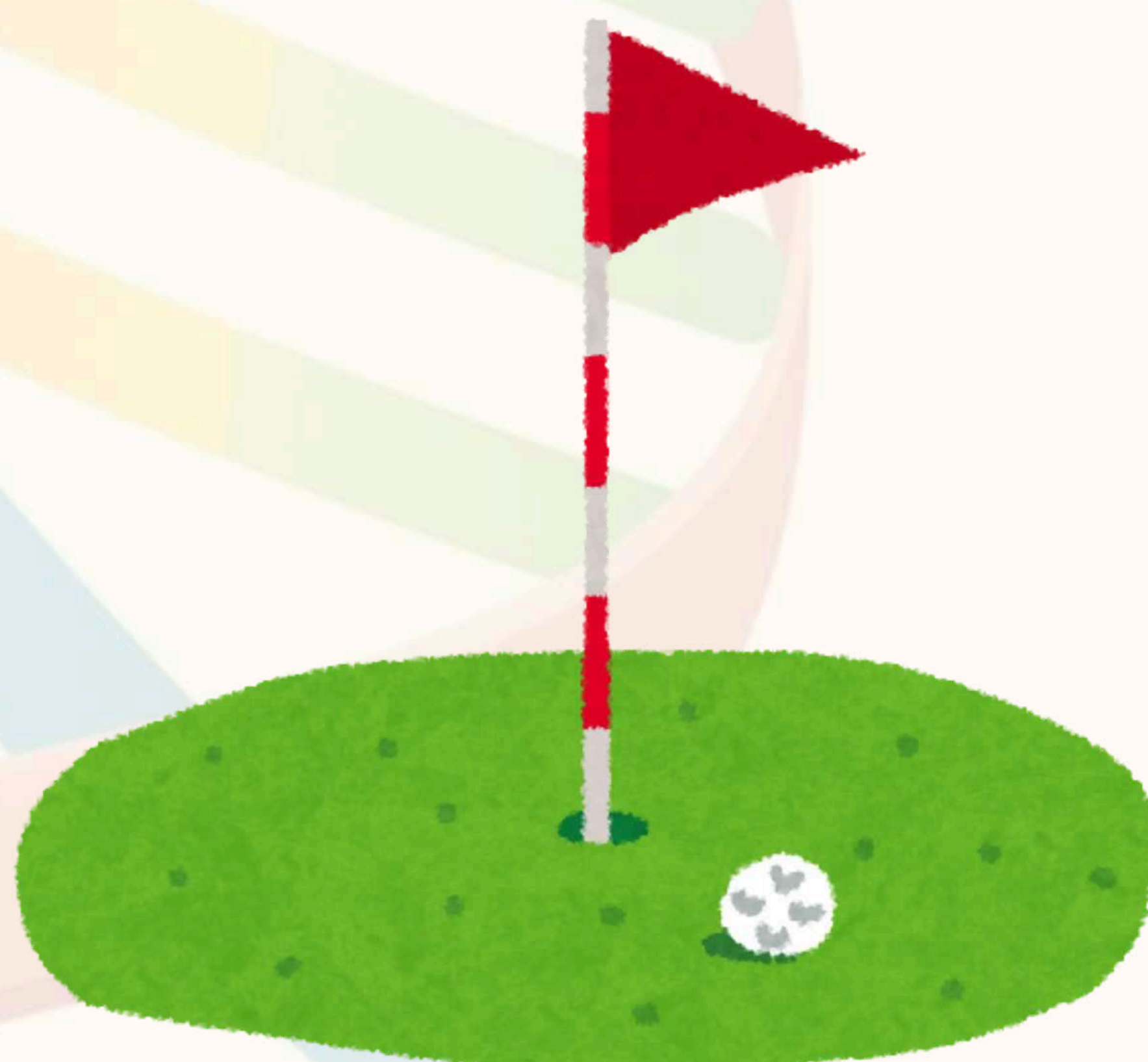




# NCR GOLF TOURNAMENT
